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Message from the President

Outdoor Play Canada (OPC) has had an exceptionally exciting and successful year in 2024! In June 2024, after much anticipation, the Canadian Centre for Outdoor Play (CCOP) opened its doors! The CCOP is a collaboration between OPC, the Healthy Active Living and Obesity (HALO) Research Group at the CHEO Research Institute, Algonquin College, and Andrew Fleck Children's Services through which we aim inspire commitment to advancing outdoor play and learning for the overall health and well-being of children in Canada. At its foundation is the Forest Explorers outdoor and nature-based early childhood program, located on 500 acres of National Capital Commission land in the west end of Ottawa, Ontario.

At the start of 2024 we received funding through the Public Health Agency of Canada to expand the initiatives of the CCOP to explore how to support children living with disability in outdoor play and learning in natural spaces. This project aims to build on the work of the CCOP in leading demonstration projects, policy and practice, providing informing professional development opportunities, conducting applied research, and leading nationwide knowledge translation mobilization efforts to advance outdoor play and learning for the health and well-being of children of all abilities in Canada.

Much progress has also been made on developing the 10-yr update to the 2015 Position Statement on Active Outdoor Play ('AOP10'), with support from The Lawson Foundation. (continued above)

that project, we established international leadership group representatives from every inhabited continent and a 130+ person Steering Committee, again with representation from inhabited continent. With this every passionate and engaged group, we launched 10 comprehensive reviews and 6 continental narrative reviews. In December 2024, the leadership group met in Seoul, South Korea (a day after martial law was called and called-off!) to review the main findings from each of these 16 reviews and use that information to create a first draft of the updated statement. That draft has since been circulated to the AOP10 Steering Committee for assessment and will next be circulated broadly as part of our international consensus-building process for this project. The final Position Statement will be launched at the 2025 Breath of Fresh Air (BoFA) Outdoor Play Summit, once again at Wesley Clover Parks in Ottawa, Ontario. We invite you to join

Opening of the Canadian Centre for Outdoor Play (CCOP)

IN JUNE 2024, THE CCOP OPENED ITS DOORS!





The Canadian Centre for Outdoor Play (CCOP) is a partnership between:









The CCOP aims to lead demonstration projects, inform policy and practice, provide professional development opportunities, conduct applied research, and lead nationwide knowledge translation and mobilization efforts to advance outdoor play and learning for the health and well-being of children of all abilities in Canada. At its foundation is the Forest Explorers outdoor and nature-based early childhood education program, located on 500 acres of National Capital Commission land in the west end of Ottawa, Ontario.

In June 2024, after much anticipation, the CCOP opened its doors! The opening was celebrated by the CCOP team, alongside colleagues, families, friends, plenty of children, government representatives, and even a few folks who were simply curious (it was an open event, after all!). We used a large burlap ribbon for the official ribbon cutting, where the resulting pieces were then re-used in the childcare program. One small piece of that ribbon has been kept for our time capsule.

Updates from the Canadian Centre for Outdoor Play (CCOP)

OVER THE PAST YEAR, THIS COLLABORATION HAS ...

Released the 'Educators Teaching Educators: Canada's Outdoor Early Childhood Education Professional Learning Continuous Framework' ('Outdoor ECE Framework'). The evidence-informed this of purpose achieve national Framework was consensus on key pedagogical practices in outdoor ECE and serve as a pedagogical tool to promote consistency and uphold quality in training and supporting outdoor ECE practitioners across Canada in their work. A year and a half was spent consulting with 300 outdoor ECE leaders and community members over three consultation phases and two rounds of national consensusbuilding surveys to develop the Framework. It is available on our website in English and French.





Launched the <u>PLaTO certificate course</u>. To ensure the practical application of the Outdoor ECE Framework, Algonquin College used this framework as a guide to develop the Play, Learn, and Teach Outdoors in the Early Years (PLaTO) certificate program to help grow the community of practitioners across the country who support outdoor play and learning for children. The first of 3 courses of that certificate was launched in September 2024!

OVER THE PAST YEAR, THIS COLLABORATION HAS... (CONTINUED)







Convened the <u>National Panel on Licensing Outdoor ECE</u>. This Panel serves to advance efforts towards changing ECE licensing regulations across provinces in Canada. In November 2024, we convened this group in St John's Newfoundland over two days to review existing efforts to advance licensing of outdoor ECE and discuss priorities and actions to move this effort forward. Panelists, guest attendees, and students attending this meeting took copious notes, from which we are now developing a forthcoming report .

Launched the SPROUT Project. In July 2024, hot on the heals of the opening of the CCOP, the HALO research group launched the three-year SPROUT (Sending PReschoolers OUTside) study, exploring the health and wellbeing of children, educators, and families participating in Forest **Explorers** program comparison conventional more programs. To date, we have a total of 73 children and their families and 27 educators enrolled in the study!





Updates from the Canadian Centre for Outdoor Play (CCOP) -SPROUT and SPROUT-Able Projects

OVER THE PAST YEAR, THIS COLLABORATION HAS... (CONTINUED)



Launched the <u>SPROUT-Able Project</u>: In January 2024, the CCOP in partnership with the Canadian Disability Participation Project secured 4-years of funding from the Public Health Agency of Canada to address challenges in the built and social environment for outdoor play and learning in natural spaces for young children living with disabilities. This project serves to build off the CCOP project, including the SPROUT Research project, to advance outdoor early childhood education in Canada, and improve quality participation in outdoor play and learning for children with disabilities.

Two main areas of focus of this project are to explore both the supportive and challenging elements of both the physical and social environment of Forest Explorers in supporting outdoor play and learning for children living with disabilities. In November 2024, our team held a World Cafe event with educators, partners, and our family engagement team to discuss these supportive and challenging elements. We had a graphic recorder pool together these lively conversations in the above infographic!

Over the Past Year...

OPC served (and continues to serve) as a community partner on the <u>Canadian Disability Participation Project</u> 2.0 (CDPP 2.0) led by Dr. Amy Latimer-Cheung out of Queen's University. This 7-year grant funded by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council supports several working groups dedicated to promoting quality participation in physical activity, including active play in the early years. OPC is the lead organization of this Active Play in the Early Years working group.



OPC **continues to serve** as a knowledge translation and network collaborator on an outdoor learning project with Dr. Tanya Halsall, a Research Scientist at the <u>Royal Ottawa</u>.



OPC **contributes** as a partner of the Outdoor Learning Store, a charitable social enterprise that offers outdoor learning equipment, resources, tools and training.



OPC **serves** on <u>Children's Health and Environment</u> (CPCHE)'s advisory committee for their annual Healthy Environments for Learning Day (HELD) event.



OPC **has become a member** of the Early Childhood Work Group at the <u>Screen Time</u> Action Network at Fairplay.



OPC **joined** the <u>1% for the Planet</u> community as an environmental partner.



The 10-Year Anniversary of the Position Statement on Active Outdoor Play



Access to active play in nature and outdoors—with its risks—is essential for healthy child development. We recommend increasing children's opportunities for self-directed play outdoors in all settings—at home, at school, in child care, the community and nature.



2015 Position Statement on Active Outdoor Play

With funding support from the Lawson Foundation, we are in our second and final year of developing the 10-Yr Anniversary update to the 2015 Position Statement on Active Outdoor Play. The 2015 Position Statement, when released, led to a galvanization of the outdoor play sector in Canada. We established an 11-person leadership group consisting of outdoor play leaders from every inhabited continent. We put out an open call for Steering Committee members and now have over 130 members supporting this work. Through this project we have:



Led the development of 10 comprehesive reviews and 6 continental narrative reviews on the relationship between active outdoor play and health and wellbeing, education, the environment, movement behaviours, nature and the environment, One health, human rights and policy, community connections and partnerships, education and learning, and social capital.

Developed a first draft of the updated Position Statement during a three-day in-person meeting in Seoul, South Korea, with the 10-Yr Anniversary Project leadership group. The group began a consensus-building process to achieve international consensus.




Mentorship

As part of the CCOP, OPC mentored Jade Groompike, Kiera Publow, Eva Quenneville, Hannah Raudssus, and Emma Zimolong in their fourth-year student thesis projects as part of the Bachelor's of Early Learning and Community Development at Algonquin College. Over two placements this group collectively worked on pulling together efforts across Canada to advance licensing of outdoor early childhood education, with Eva and Emma focusing on policy work in this area in Canada, and Kiera, Jade and Hannah focusing on broader initiatives. Their collective work has informed the development of a report on this very topic that is soon to be released!
