



The SPROUT-able Project is an extension of the SPROUT study, a three-year research initiative launched by the Healthy Active Living and Obesity (HALO) Research Group. It expands upon the SPROUT Study by investigating how children with disabilities engage in outdoor play and learning. The SPROUT-able project aims to enhance the physical and social environments of outdoor childcare programs, support professional development for early childhood educators, and design evidence-based strategies to promote inclusive outdoor play. These project initiatives are led by Outdoor Play Canada's Project Manager, Paula ter Huurne, RECE, to integrate a strong practice-based perspective into the research. The SPROUT-able research is spearheaded by Dr. Maeghan James, an Assistant Professor at the University of Ottawa, in collaboration with Dr. Kelly Arbour-Nicitopoulos and the ADAPT Lab at the University of Toronto.

Project Updates



Inclusive Outdoor Learning Kits and Puppet Resource

We launched the Inclusive Outdoor Learning Kits in partnership with the OLSS, featuring tools to support outdoor learning for children with disabilities, and a new tip sheet, Supporting Inclusion Outside with Puppets!



The SPROUT-able Inclusive Library at Forest Explorers

Our team has launched a new resource library at Forest Explorers, which contains books curated specifically to support inclusive and diverse storytelling in natural settings.



Video Modules, Tip sheets, and Resources for Educators

We've released four video modules with tip sheets and resources to help educators support inclusive outdoor play, addressing health, safety, sensory needs, and risky play. Our new resource page will make all materials easy to access.



Forest Explorers Active Outdoor Play Toolkit

U of T students are co-developing an evidence-informed toolkit to help educators promote active outdoor play at Forest Explorers, grounded in occupational and rehabilitation science.



Assessing the Impact of Time Outside

We completed year one of the SPROUT Study, with 86 participants (56 from Forest Explorers). Among them, 17 children took part in SPROUT-able, including those with diagnosed or functional difficulties and those supported by inclusion staff.



Capturing Diverse Play Experiences Outdoors

To capture outdoor play from children's perspectives, we're using GoPro cameras with SPROUT-able participants each season. We've collected our first set of winter footage and continue gathering data across the year.



Accessibility and Inclusion Strategic Plan

We hosted a World Café with educators and SPROUT-able partners to explore barriers and facilitators of inclusion at Forest Explorers. Insights from these discussions informed the creation of our Accessibility and Inclusion Strategic Plan.



Interviews with Parents and Educators

We are in the process of developing a qualitative study using interviews to explore the barriers and facilitators to outdoor play in childcare settings (both at Forest Explorers and the control sites)
